By completing this elector response form I oppose the Cobble Hill Improvement District's (CHID) intention to borrow a sum not to exceed five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000), repayable not later than ten (10) years from the date of issue, at an estimated tax increase of \$200 per year for each property within the District, for the purpose of upgrading waterlines to achieve residential fire flows throughout the current system, unless a vote is held.

The deadline for submitting this elector response form to the Cobble Hill Improvement District is 4:00 p.m. on August 10, 2024. Submissions must be made by first class mail to Cobble Hill Improvement District, P.O. Box 1027, Cobble Hill, BC V8H 4C9.

The Cobble Hill Improvement District Board of Trustees may proceed with borrowing to upgrade waterlines to achieve residential fire flows throughout the current system, unless 38 electors sign and submit a completed copy of this elector response form to the Cobble Hill Improvement District by the deadline.

A person must not sign more than one elector response form in relation to this alternative approval process.

ELECTOR QUALIFICATIONS:

Only electors of the Cobble Hill Improvement District are eligible to sign the elector response forms.

Electors must meet all of the following qualifications:

- 1) is a Canadian citizen
- 2) is 18 years of age or older
- 3) is an owner of land within the Cobble Hill Improvement District
- 4) is a resident of the province of British Columbia for the prior six months

One vote is also allowed for each board or corporation that owns land within the improvement district. The board or corporation must designate one person to act as an authorized agent to vote on its behalf. This should be done in writing so the chair or returning officer can verify the vote.

If more than one person is registered on title as an owner of land, each one can vote as long as they also meet the other qualifications. However, no person can have two votes unless they meet the qualifications to be an elector and are also an agent authorized to vote on behalf of a board or corporation.
